

# Johnson & Johnson Statement on September 12, 2022, The New Yorker Article

**SEPTEMBER 12, 2022**

The New Yorker September 12, 2022, article regarding the Company's talc litigation presents a one-sided, false and misleading story.

Our cosmetic talc is safe, does not contain asbestos and does not cause cancer. We do not believe that any of the talc-related claims against the Company have merit, nor do we believe our products are responsible for any illness. We continue to stand firmly behind the safety of talc-based Johnson's Baby Powder and are confident in the merits of our legal position.

Lacking justification for their legal arguments and to distract from their unwillingness to come to an equitable resolution, plaintiff lawyers are attempting to try the case through the media and in the public. We will continue to stick to the facts and present our position before the court.
